Subject objectives

The subject offers students' knowledge about the history of the EU and its basic institutions. Students will learn what business politics is applied in the EU, how EU impacts the development of rural areas, what are the attitudes of the leading EU institutions connected with industrial, common agricultural and regional politics. The aim is to be introduced with historical and institutional concept of European economic environment, modern analysis of the European integration, macroeconomic units, and common politics of strategic development.

Subject outcomes

After successful passing the course, students will learn about the basic knowledge and facts, principles and processes connected with the EU. Students will be able to practically apply the acquired knowledge in the analysis of the basic macroeconomic indicators in the EU. In that way, they will learn about the commercial, industrial, regional, agricultural and other politics in the EU that have significant implications on our country, too.

Regulatory politics: internal market, competition politics, 7. Social and ecological politics; 8. Budget of the EU and transfer politics: Euro-monetary politics. 9. Common agricultural politics, development and cohesion politics; Macroeconomic politics; economic and monetary union, employment politics and tax politics; 10. Policy of citizen protection in the EU: economic, social and political law; law and internal business; asylum, visas and immigration politics; 11. Relations in the EU and GATT/WTO.12. commercial politics and external economic business, security and defense politics13. Common external and security politics. 14. EU enlargement; 15. The relations of Serbia and EU
